Jesus: The Miracle Man "More than a Touch" Wylie United Methodist Church Pastor Jeff Hatcher – June 23, 2013

<u>Mark 1:35-45</u>

35 Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. 36 Simon and his companions went to look for him, 37 and when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!" 38 Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else — to the nearby villages — so I can preach there also. That is why I have come." 39 So he traveled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons. 40 A man with leprosy came to him and begged him on his knees, "If you are willing, you can make me clean." 41 Filled with compassion, Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" 42 Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cured. 43 Jesus sent him away at once with a strong warning: 44 "See that you don't tell this to anyone. But go, show yourself to the priest and offer the sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing, as a testimony to them." 45 Instead he went out and began to talk freely, spreading the news. As a result, Jesus could no longer enter a town openly but stayed outside in lonely places. Yet the people still came to him from everywhere.

Leprosy in Biblical Times:

- Highly contagious
- Incurable
- Disfigurement
- Untouchable by law (seen as unclean)
- Seen as result of sin in life
- Great Pain (digressing to lack of pain)
- Alienation from family and society

Lev 13:43-46

43 The priest is to examine him, and if the swollen sore on his head or forehead is reddish-white like an infectious skin disease, 44 the man is diseased and is unclean. The priest shall pronounce him unclean because of the sore on his head. 45 "The person with such an infectious disease must wear torn clothes, let his hair be unkempt, cover the lower part of his face and cry out, 'Unclean! Unclean!' 46 As long as he has the infection he remains unclean. He must live alone; he must live outside the camp.

I. THE LEPER SOUGHT JESUS THROUGH BROKENNESS

v. 40 A man with leprosy came to him and <u>begged him on his</u> <u>knees</u>, "<u>If you are willing</u>, <u>you can make me clean</u>."

2. JESUS RESPONDED IN <u>COMPASSION</u> AND <u>POWER</u>

v. 41 <u>Filled with compassion</u>, Jesus <u>reached out his hand and</u> <u>touched the man</u>. "<u>I am willing</u>," he said. "<u>Be clean</u>!" 42 <u>Immediately</u> the leprosy left him and <u>he was cured</u>.

3. GOD WAS <u>GLORIFIED</u>

v. 44 ... But go, <u>show yourself to the priest</u> and <u>offer the</u> <u>sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing</u>, as <u>a</u> <u>testimony to them</u>." 45 Instead he went out and <u>began to talk</u> <u>freely</u>, <u>spreading the news</u>.
