"What if Jesus said NO to the Cross?"

Isa 53:4-7

4 Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. 6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. 7 He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

Jesus could have said NO...

I. BEFORE HE <u>ENTERED</u> JERUSALEM TO THE <u>CHEERING</u> CROWDS

Mark 10:32-34

32 They were on their way up to Jerusalem, with Jesus leading the way, and the disciples were astonished, while those who followed were afraid. Again he took the Twelve aside and told them what was going to happen to him. 33 "We are going up to Jerusalem," he said, "and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles, 34 who will mock him and spit on him, flog him and kill him. Three days later he will rise."

Jesus could have said NO...

2. AT HIS LAST SUPPER AS HE <u>WASHED</u> THE DISCIPLES FEET

Matt 26:20-24

20 When evening came, Jesus was reclining at the table with the Twelve. 21 And while they were eating, he said, "I tell you the truth, one of you will betray me." 22 They were very sad and began to say to him one after the other, "Surely not I, Lord?" 23 Jesus replied, "The one who has dipped his hand into the bowl with me will betray me. 24 The Son of Man will go just as it is written about him.

<u>John 13:5</u>

After [the meal], [Jesus] poured water into a basin and <u>began to wash his disciples'</u> feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

Jesus could have said NO...

3. AS HE <u>AGONIZED</u> IN PRAYER WHILE THE DISCIPLES SLEPT

Mark 14:32-36

32 They went to a place called Gethsemane, and Jesus said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray." 33 He took Peter, James and John along with him, and he began to be deeply distressed and troubled. 34 "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death," he said to them. "Stay here and keep watch." 35 Going a little farther, he fell to the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from him. 36 "Abba, Father," he said, "everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."

Luke 22:44

44 And <u>being in anguish</u>, he prayed more earnestly, and <u>his sweat was like drops of</u> blood falling to the ground.

Jesus could have said NO...

4. AS HE WAS <u>BETRAYED</u> BY HIS FRIEND AND <u>ARRESTED</u>

Matt 26:49-54

49 Going at once to Jesus, Judas said, "Greetings, Rabbi!" and kissed him. 50 Jesus replied, "Friend, do what you came for." Then the men stepped forward, seized Jesus and arrested him. 51 With that, one of Jesus' companions reached for his sword, drew it out and struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his ear. 52 "Put your sword back in its place," Jesus said to him, "for all who draw the sword will die by the sword. 53 Do you think I cannot call on my Father, and he will at once <u>put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels?</u> 54 But how then would the Scriptures be fulfilled that say it must happen in this way?"

Iesus could have said NO...

5. AS HE WAS MOCKED AND YET FORGAVE

Mark 15:32

32 Let this Christ, this King of Israel, <u>come down now from the cross</u>, that <u>we may</u> <u>see and believe</u>."

Luke 23:34

Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

CONCLUSION

Jesus could have said NO to the cross,

But He didn't---HE SAID YES.

So Why did He do it? BECAUSE HE LOVES YOU AND ME!

John 3:16
