"Finish Strong: Begin with the End in Mind" Wylie United Methodist Church Pastor Jeff Hatcher – January 12, 2014

2 Tim 2:1-26

I You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. 2 And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable men who will also be qualified to teach others. 3 Endure hardship with us like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. 4 No one serving as a soldier gets involved in civilian affairs — he wants to please his commanding officer. 5 Similarly, if anyone competes as an athlete, he does not receive the victor's crown unless he competes according to the rules. 6 The hardworking farmer should be the first to receive a share of the crops. 7 Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you insight into all this. 8 Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my gospel, 9 for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's word is not chained. 10 Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. 11 Here is a trustworthy saying: If we died with him, we will also live with him; 12 if we endure, we will also reign with him. If we disown him, he will also disown us; 13 if we are faithless, he will remain faithful, for he cannot disown himself. 14 Keep reminding them of these things. Warn them before God against quarreling about words; it is of no value, and only ruins those who listen. 15 Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth. 16 Avoid godless chatter, because those who indulge in it will become more and more ungodly. 17 Their teaching will spread like gangrene. Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus, 18 who have wandered away from the truth. They say that the resurrection has already taken place, and they destroy the faith of some. 19 Nevertheless, God's solid foundation stands firm, sealed with this inscription: "The Lord knows those who are his," and, "Everyone who confesses the name of the Lord must turn away from wickedness." 20 In a large house there are articles not only of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay; some are for noble purposes and some for ignoble. 21 If a man cleanses himself from the latter, he will be an instrument for noble purposes, made holy, useful to the Master and prepared to do any good work. 22 Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart. 23 Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels. 24 And the Lord's servant must not quarrel; instead, he must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful. 25 Those who oppose him he must gently instruct, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth, 26 and that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will.

To Finish Strong...

1. CONDUCT OURSELVES WITH INTEGRITY.

- v. 15 <u>Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly</u> handles the word of truth.
- v. 22 Flee the evil desires of youth, and <u>pursue righteousness</u>, <u>faith</u>, <u>love</u> and <u>peace</u>, along with those who <u>call on the Lord out</u> <u>of a pure heart</u>.

2. REMEMBER THAT PEOPLE ARE PRECIOUS.

- v. 10 Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.
- v. 2 And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable men who will also be qualified to teach others.

3. KEEP THE FIRST THING FIRST.

1 Cor 15:3-5

- 3 For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve.
- v. 23 <u>Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments</u>, because you know <u>they produce quarrels</u>.
- v. 24 And the Lord's servant must not quarrel; instead, he must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful.
- v. 25 Those who oppose him he must <u>gently instruct</u>, in the <u>hope that God will grant them repentance</u> leading them to a <u>knowledge of the truth</u>...
- v. 16 <u>Avoid godless chatter</u>, because those who indulge in it will become more and more ungodly.
