Foretold One: Suffering Savior

Isaiah 53:3-6

3 He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their face she was despised, and we esteemed him not. 4 Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. 6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

We need a suffering Savior because...

I. WE ARE A <u>BROKEN</u> PEOPLE IN NEED OF SAVING

Isaiah 53:4-5

4 Surely <u>he took up OUR infirmities</u> and <u>carried OUR</u> <u>sorrows</u>... 5 But <u>he was pierced for OUR transgressions</u>, he was <u>crushed for OUR iniquities</u>...

Rom 3:23

23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

2. GOD HAD AN <u>INTENTIONAL</u> PLAN TO <u>SAVE</u> US

Isaiah 53:6

6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and <u>THE LORD has laid on HIM the iniquity of</u> US ALL.

3. JESUS WAS THE WILLING <u>FULFILLMENT</u> OF THAT PLAN

Isaiah 53:5

5 ... the <u>punishment that brought US peace was upon HIM</u>, and by HIS wounds WE are healed.

John 10:17-18

17 The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life — only to take it up again. 18 No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord..."

Luke 22:42-44

42 "Father, if you are willing, <u>take this cup from me</u>; yet <u>not my will</u>, but <u>yours be done</u>." 43 An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. 44 And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and <u>his sweat was like drops of blood</u> falling to the ground.

CONCLUSION

Mark 10:32-34

32 They (Jesus and His disciples) were on their way up to Jerusalem, with Jesus leading the way, and the disciples were astonished, while those who followed were afraid. Again he took the Twelve aside and told them what was going to happen to him. 33 "We are going up to Jerusalem," he said, "and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and teachers of the law.
